HAZARDOUS MATERIALS SAFETY CHECKLIST Implement a written policy on hazard management, including Material Safety Data Sheets 01 (MSDS), labeling, and training. Train all employees on working with hazardous materials — and document that training. 02 Training should include: understanding the chemicals workers may be exposed to; how to read/understand MSDS and chemical labels; how to avoid exposure; and what to do in the event of exposure. Maintain a continually updated list of hazardous materials in the warehouse, and im-03 plement a system to ensure that every incoming chemical is accompanied by a MSDS. Ensure that all containers with hazardous materials are properly labeled with the 04 material's name, manufacturer's name and address, and appropriate hazard warnings. Ensure that all chemicals are stored — and disposed of — in accordance with the 05 manufacturer's recommendations and all applicable fire codes. Provide proper personal protective equipment (PPE) to employees who handle chemi-06 cals; provide appropriate cleanup kits for hazmat spills; and provide training on how to react to spills. Provide all outside contractors with a complete list of chemical products, hazards, and 07 precautions. Review your hazard management policies and procedures regularly, to maintain the 80 effectiveness of your hazmat safety program.
